

The diner was first established in 1995 by Laurie and Bob Manley, along with Bruce Dean, in the small town of Mt. Shasta, California, which is located an hour from the Oregon border. They envisioned a place where family and friends could gather to enjoy great food and service at an affordable price.

Since its inception, Black Bear Diner has been known for its generous portions of delicious food. which has helped build a strong reputation among both locals and travelers. In the early days, the team worked long hours, even hosting "Jukebox Mondays," when they would empty the quarters guests had inserted into the diner's jukebox. The founders even provided diner keys to select friends so they could start brewing coffee before Bruce arrived to begin cooking for the day. Fresh ingredients have always been a priority for them. Their biscuits, which are as big as your head, are baked fresh every day, and they have a machine that squeezes

whole, fresh, local oranges to create freshly squeezed

orange juice. Many of their recipes come from Laurie's Italian American family, who were among the area's earliest settlers, and included Nonna's

marinara sauce. The diner also offers unique menu items that customers wouldn't find elsewhere, such as homemade Italian sausage and in-house corned beef hash made from slow-roasted beef brisket. Their homemade meatloaf quickly became a favorite among customers.

Word about this cozy diner off Interstate 5 spread quickly, leading people to ask when a Black Bear Diner would open in their town. The demand for quality food, great value, and friendly service in a comfortable environment has been a winning combination for success. Today, Black Bear Diner proudly serves 143 communities across 14 states, with that number continuing to grow.

The inspiration for Black Bear Diner comes from an 1861 gold prospector named Sisson, who fell in love with the strawberry valley in Northern California and opened an inn near what is now called Mt. Shasta. This city overlooks wild berry patches that were frequented by both bears and people. As travelers discovered Sisson's hospitality, characterized by large portions of quality food in a friendly atmosphere, this standard became the hallmark of today's Black Bear Diner.

Every Black Bear Diner features carved bears with unique themes (such as skiers and fighter pilots) that reflect their location. All of these bears have been carved with a chainsaw by Ray S. Schulz, who has

created about 4,000 bears for various locations. Additionally, owner Bob Manley is a sculptor and art enthusiast, and each diner features colorful, bear-themed murals created by Steve and Gary Fitzgerald of Mt. Shasta.

Black Bear Diner is located at 6706 W. Expressway 83 in Harlingen and is open from 6 AM to 10 PM, Monday through Sunday.

La Feria City Meeting

Lighting of the Tree, Parade Route, Discussion of South Texas International Marathon, & More!

La Feria's city meeting was held on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, and was called to order at 6:30 PM by Mayor Olga H. Maldonado. Frank Rios, the city manager, led the meeting. During the course of the meeting, no visitors made any comments or interjections. There were five items on the consent agenda:

Consideration and possible action on ordinance 2024-07 closing Commercial Ave. for the lighting of the tree on November 21, 2024.

Consideration and possible action on Ordinance 2024-08 closing Main Street for a Christmas parade on December 14, 2024.

Consideration and possible action on Ordinance 2024-9 closing streets for the South Texas International Marathon on December 8, 2024.

Consideration and possible action to approve Covered Applications and Prohibited Technology Policy required by Senate Bill 1893

Discuss, consider, and adopt a resolution authorizing the submission of a Texas Community Development Block Grant program application to the Texas Department of Agriculture for the 2025-2026 Community Development Fund.

Following this order, the council discussed the items listed on the agenda.

1. Consideration and possible action on ordinance 2024-07 closing Commercial Ave. for the lighting of the tree on November 21, 2024.

The City Manager mentioned meeting with the school district and getting them on board with the lighting of the tree ceremony. He also included that they had hired a band to perform at the event. The motion was carried.

2. Consideration and possible action on Ordinance 2024-08 closing Main Street for a Christmas parade on December 14, 2024.

The City Manager explained that he and the Public Works Director tried looking for a different route to take this year due to other city projects taking place in this area. However, upon further exploration, he concluded that the current route is the best to proceed with. He also mentioned that he would respectfully ask the public to set up on the west side as the east may be under construction, keeping safety in mind. This motion was passed.

3. Consideration and possible action on Ordinance 2024-9 closing streets for the South Texas International Marathon on December 8, 2024.

The City Manager said that he met with Bastio Rendosa, who had successfully orchestrated the first Texas International Marathon, to review a few locations where they could hold this event. He also mentioned that Bastio Rendosa had altered a couple of things such as the route

they would be taking and where they would be concluding the two-hour marathon. This motion was passed.

4. Consideration and possible action to approve Covered Applications and Prohibited Technology Policy required by Senate Bill 1893.

The City Manager explained how in December 2022 Governor Greg Abbot required that all stagnant CEs ban the video-sharing app TikTok on all State issue devices. He adds that TikTok is owned by a Chinese

party, a communist country, and can be used to spy on Texans and obtain sensitive information. The motion was carried.

5. Discuss, consider, and adopt a resolution authorizing the submission of a Texas **Community Development** Block Grant program application to the Texas Department of Agriculture for the 2025-2026 Community Development Fund. The City Manager informed the council that

a resolution concerning the ideal projects that are required to be worked on to benefit the city such as street improvements, wastewater projects, etc. He also explains that he believes the City of La Feria would score high in the proposal of the needed grants considering that the city has not participated in this for the last four years. Once again, the motion was carried.

The meeting was then adjourned.

began advocating for research into the causes of intellectual disabilities in 1948. Eunice and her husband, Sargent Shriver, traveled across the United States in 1958 to learn more about children and adults with intellectual disabilities.

The event, known as Shriver Camp, included dozens of young people from local agencies and institutions, with ages ranging from 6 to 16. To achieve a one-onone instruction ratio for each camper, volunteer counselors from local colleges and high schools were recruited to assist during this event.

After seven years of successful summer camps, a growing number of participants, and new advancements in education surrounding intellectual disabilities, Eunice Kennedy Shriver and the Chicago Park District held a news conference

first "Olympic" games for children with intellectual disabilities.

On August 2, 1968, the Special Olympics were officially incorporated. Then, on December 2, 1968, Senator Edward Kennedy introduced the formation of the Special Olympics, which began with a seven-member board of directors.

Throughout the 1970s, the Special Olympics continued to grow, with thousands of athletes participating from across the United States.

Today, the Special Olympics has expanded to include more than 5.3 million athletes and their unified partners, setting a new global record. These remarkable athletes have taken part in over 108,000 competitions and games in more than 170 countries, reflecting the vision of founder Eunice Kennedy Shriver.


The 2024 La Feria Veterans Day Celebration was held on Monday, November 11, at the La Feria Veterans Memorial Monument from 9 a.m. to
